### Small Basket

#### Crochet Basket in Knitted Stitch

#### **TENSION**

9 dc x 10 rows = 10 x 10 cm

#### **ABBREVIATIONS**

sl stslip stitchdcdouble crochetchchainst(s)stitch(es)rdroundkstknitted stitch

#### NOTES

The knitted stitch is a variation of the double crochet: you do not work through the two loops on top of the stitch but through the V-formed "heart" of the stitch (see picture 1), thus a quite dense structure is built, which looks like a knitted stitch. For the sides of the basket the knitted stitches are worked alternately with double crochet stitches, which are worked into the back loop of the previous round. A look like a brioche pattern is created that way. It is important to work loosely so that the hook can easily be inserted into the "heart" of the stitches, which is rather dense.



#### INSTRUCTION

Base: Start with a Magic Ring in which 8 dc are worked = 1st rd, closed with a sl st.

Rd 2: 1 ch (does not count as stitch), 1 inc in every stitch (16 sts)

Rd 3: 1 ch (does not count as stitch), \* 1 dc, 1 inc\*, rep von \* to \* to end of round (24 sts)

Rd 4: 1 ch (does not count as stitch), \* 2 dc, 1 inc\*, rep from \* to \* to end (32 sts)

Rd 5: 1 ch (does not count as stitch), \* 3 dc, 1 inc\*, rep from \* to \* to end (40 sts)

Rd 6: 1 ch (does not count as stitch), \* 4 dc, 1 inc\*, rep from \* to \* to end (48 sts) Rd 7: 1 ch (does not count as stitch), \* 5 dc, 1 inc\*, rep from \* to \* to end (56 sts)

Rd 8: 1 ch (does not count as stitch), 1 dc in every st

Rd 9: 1 ch (does not count as stitch), 1 dc in every st through back loop only Rd 10: 1 ch (does not count as stitch),  $\star$  1 dc into back loop, 1 kst $\star$ , rep from  $\star$  to  $\star$  to end, 1 sl st

Work more rounds until the yarn runs out, close the rd with a sl st. The yarn might be enough for 10 -11 Rd. Cut thread. To weave in the ends, divide the yarn into single strands to make weaving easier and nearly invisible.

Note: Due to the fact, that Crafty Fine yarn is recycled from colour-assorted textile material and not re-dyed there can be slight variations in color and thickness. We therefore recommend buying enough yarn for your project. We also advise to use a crochet needle without handle, which is easier to work with. The first stitches might be a little bit hard to work, but you will soon get used, and the final result is worth it.

#### **WASHING ADVICE**

- Always wash in as warm a water temperature as possible up to the temperature recommended, with a short spin. Use a lot of water if hand washing. For darker colours we recommend the use of discolouration sheets.
- Do not bleach.
- Do not tumble dry. Drip-dry on a horizontal surface.
- Iron on a hot temperature setting using a damp cloth.
- Professional dry cleaning in tetrachloroethylene.
- Do not use optical brighteners (or any detergent containing optical brighteners). We recommend to use a softener to preserve the natural softness of the yarn.
